Thoughts and Prayers

You'd have to be living an "off the grid" lifestyle to be unaware of evil things that have happened recently in places like Buffalo, NY or Uvalde, TX. These are not isolated incidents because similar attacks on society are occurring all over the world such as Sunday's attack on a Catholic church in Nigeria that killed dozens and wounded many more. One of the earliest attacks on a school in the US took place in 1927 in Bath Township, Michigan. A disgruntled school board member detonated explosives, killing 38 children, 6 adults and wounding another 58! He intended to blow up the whole school but other devices did not go off. Since then, far too many similar attacks have taken place in schools, churches, and other areas where people congregate.

When these horrible things happen, you'll often hear many Christians and even public figures call for "thoughts and prayers" on behalf of the victims and their families. Certainly this is the Christian's first response because we need to approach our heavenly Father to seek comfort, peace and guidance in times of need. Of course, we don't believe that prayer is all that is needed in life because the Lord expects us to follow His will. Yet, prayer is vital.

The importance of prayer needs to be emphasized because it is often belittled and disparaged by some in the media and politics. This is to be expected from those who refuse to see things from God's spiritual perspective as I Corinthians 2:14 indicates, "The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of god, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned." (ESV)



Let us, God's people, be known for our commitment to prayer! Not to be seen by men, but to stress the importance of prayer to our Creator and Loving Father who wants us to approach His "throne of grace" (Hebrews 4:16) at all times! Don't be discouraged or enraged at the ignorance of unbelievers because that is to be expected just as the Scriptures indicate. Stay faithful, continue in prayer, obey the Lord! Think deeply and live the words of Paul found in Philippians 2:13-16, "...it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure. ¹⁴ Do all things without grumbling or questioning, ¹⁵ that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, ¹⁶ holding fast to the word of life..." -Mark Hammitt



June 14 | 10 AM


FFC and WRYG will go to the Planetarium at King High School. If you are interested in attending please see Stephen or Kenneth.
