"Lord, Defeat Us!"

I always appreciate many things that are said in public prayers. I'm especially thankful for those things that can really make participants think seriously about the type of lives we are living. One of those phrases sometimes used is, "Lord, defeat us when we sin and rebel against your will." Wait! Should we pray for God to defeat us? Is this appropriate? Consider some brief thoughts on the matter.

Ist, we often ask God for blessings when we please Him and we usually ask Him to help us in times of need. Yet, we may forget that God can be displeased with us when we willfully and even unknowingly live in opposition to His will. The Lord will not hear our prayers when we defiantly sin against Him (Ps 66:18; Pr 28:9).

2nd, our souls are at stake! Unless the rebellious sinner realizes the eternal nature of unforgiven sin, their soul will be lost. Woe to the one who believes that God will not hold him accountable! Acts 3:19 states clearly, "Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out." We also must repent or turn from sin and seek forgiveness on God's terms.

3rd, as we plead with the Lord to defeat us if we sin against Him, let's be humble enough to seek His forgiveness. The one change in life that will lead to a fulfilling life in Christ is the change from PRIDE to HUMILITY. As we stand before God, we must be willing to accept His direction and His commands. Praying for God to defeat us when we sin is a recognition of true humility. As he addressed the pride of the Jewish leaders, Jesus told



His disciples, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." (Mt 23:12)

May the Lord truly defeat His people if we rebel against Him! -Mark Hammitt

Teens Eat Out


March 16 | 8-9 PM


FFC Science Museum March 26 | 10 AM
