Why A Sermon On Giving?

Each year for the past 45 years, at least two sermons at the beginning of December have focused on giving to the Lord. Specifically our obligation to give to the Lord of what we have been blessed. We often stress singing, prayer, the Lord's Supper and preaching as part of weekly worship. Yet, another important part of worship is giving or contributing to the work of the church.

As we plan for next year's (2024) budget, it is helpful to know that our weekly contributions have been more than twenty percent under budget for 2023. Some of that may be due to members who have moved away or the economy. Yet, it is always good to evaluate every aspect of our life in Christ to make sure we are living up to God's expectations. Should we clean up our language or attitude? Perhaps we need to evaluate our relationships? Another area of improvement may be our worship which includes prayer, singing, partaking of the Lord's Supper, taking in the Word of God and giving of our financial blessings.

The challenge for the new year of 2024 is that we give generously to the Lord and His work. Remember God knows our hearts and He also knows our individual financial

standing. You may give what many consider to be a small amount each week, but God knows if it is generous according to your ability. You may give a great amount, but again, God knows your heart and your ability. Certainly no man can judge your giving, BUT God will most assuredly do so with His perfect judgement.

One question often asked is, "Do I need to tithe, or give ten percent?" There is no New Testament



command to tithe. You may purpose or plan to give close to that amount or you may work to give more than that amount. Just remember, it is God who knows everything about us and it is God who expects our best of everything we do in life.

Paul gave instructions concerning our approach to giving in <u>2 Corinthians 9:6-9</u>, The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. ⁹ As it is written, "He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever."
