

40th ANNUAL BIBLE BOWL UPDATE

This year's Bible Bowl was a success, as always! The reason we can call it a success is because almost 100 young people studied the Bible (Acts 15-28) over the last few months and came to participate in friendly competition. The tests challenged these 2nd-12th graders to recall information from Acts of the Apostles chapters 15-28 with memory verses, memory work from throughout the Bible and more. This was our 40th competition which started in 1985 (we held two Bible Bowls in 1997).

This year there were 98 participants and 11 congregations (we are building back up since the pandemic years). Congregations represented were: Arlington Heights (Corpus Christi), Colleyville, Graeber Road (Rosenberg), Guadalupe Valley (New Braunfels), Lackland Terrace (San Antonio), LaVernia, Mid-Town (Victoria), Nixon, Pleasanton, Port Lavaca, and Weber Road. Many parents and other adults also came for the day and we thank all those who taught, supported and encouraged these young people.

Many adults from other congregations helped us during the day's activities and we really appreciate their help each year. Many Weber Road members came to help before, during and after Bible Bowl. Many

brought refreshments, worked in the kitchen serving pizza and goodies during lunch, provided security, set up, cleaned up, worked in the grading room, helped with testing, attended the nursery, taught our people, young helped in many other areas not mentioned in this article. THANK YOU!

Next year's Bible Bowl is set for Saturday, November 9, 2024. The topic of study is "Facts of the Bible."
