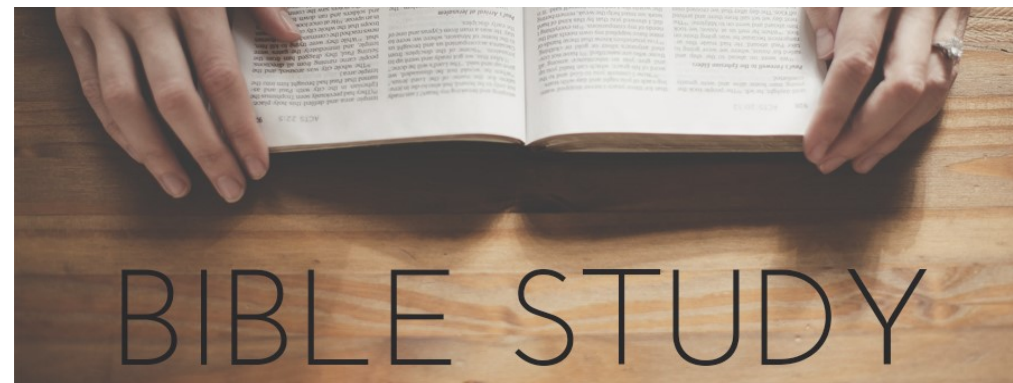

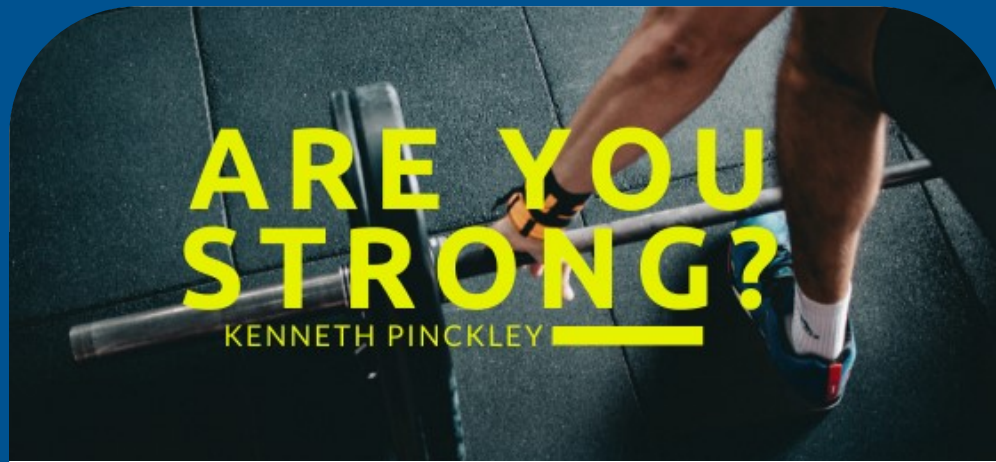

Back a few weeks ago, when everyone made New Year's Resolutions, one of the more popular resolutions is getting active in a gym. There is a push in our culture to be more healthy and stronger. There are competitions derived from workouts. Crossfit has become widely popular in America. There is a quote in one of my favorite movies asking "How strong are you?". How would you answer that question? Are you one that is in the gym daily for hours? Are you a couch potato? How would you, as a Christian, answer, "How strong is your faith"?

The Hebrew writer defines faith as "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb 11:1). The Hebrew writes that we are to run with endurance the race set before us fixing our eyes on Jesus. Paul also describes Christianity as a race in 1 Corinthians 9 and 2 Timothy 4. As Christian we need to continually be exercising our faith. We need to continually work on bringing our bodies under control. It takes a conscience effort to produce the weight loss or muscle gain. It also takes this same effort to grow and mature in our faith.

How can we exercise our faith? I am not suggesting for someone to place themselves in a temptation to fight it. Yet we can find alternatives to test and challenge our faith in God. We can dive deeper in study. We can build study groups. We can go serve our local community. We need to force ourselves out of our comfort zone. We need to be more uncomfortable. Imagine for a moment, if everyone here for a week would exercise their faith. We would invite others. We would open our Bible to study with someone. We pray to God more fervently. Imagine what we could accomplish? Now let us exercise!

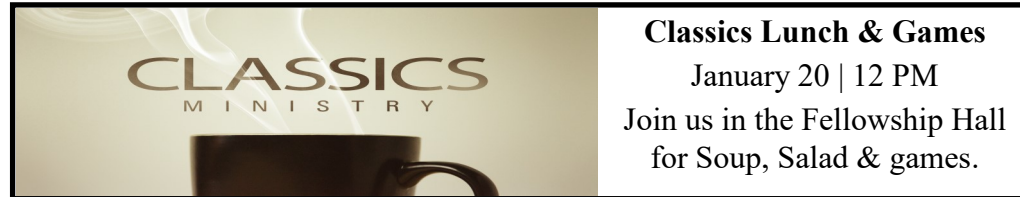
FIELD TRIP - SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 12

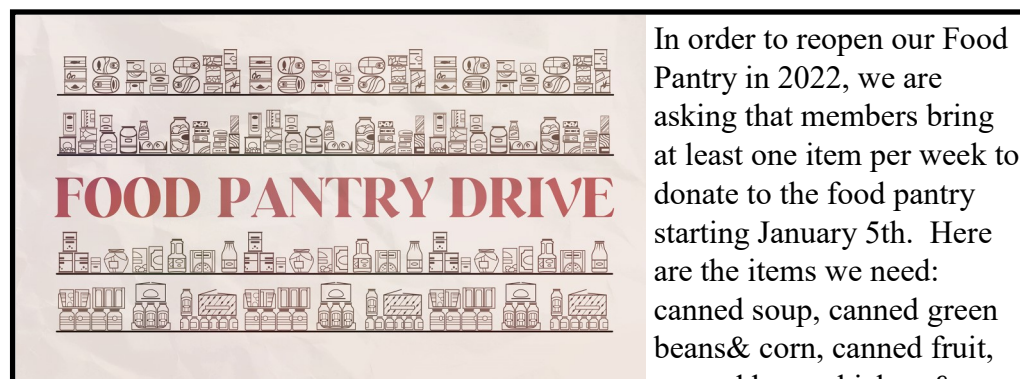
