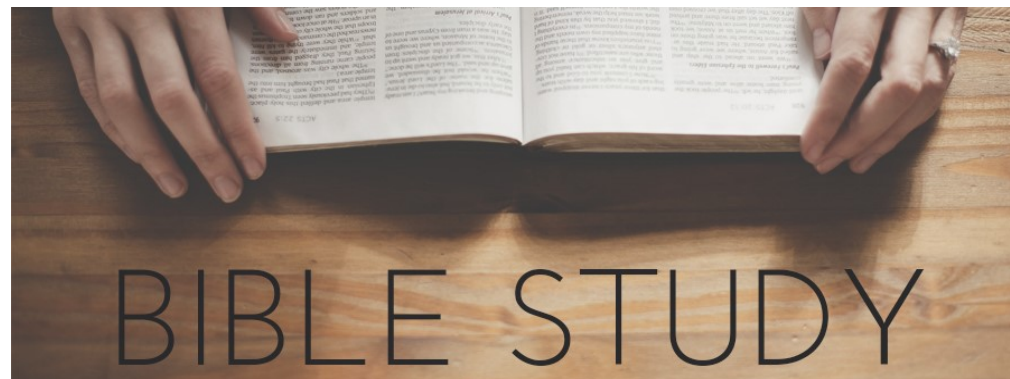

We Don't talk about... Kenneth Pinckley

November 24, 2021, Disney released a movie call *Encanto*. A movie about the family Madrigal, a gifted extended family with special gifts. This will contain no spoilers, just in case you want to watch it. It is a good movie for both parents and kids. As with most Disney movies, this too is a musical with catchy tunes, so brace yourself. There is one particular song called "We Don't Talk about Bruno". The gist of the song is they do not talk about Bruno for some things he has said in done in their past (again no spoiler). So, are there things that we "don't talk about?"

Do we talk about the Church? Paul in Ephesians describes the Church as the bride of Jesus. Christ loved the bride so much that He was willing to die for the Church. I love my beautiful bride. I think about her often. I talk about her often. I talk about my son often. I am that dad that shows them off when I go visit friends. Are we doing the same with our Church family? Are we showing pictures of Church events? Are we compartmentalizing this aspect of our life? We go but we do not share with our neighbors, friends, or co-workers.

Do we talk about our faith? Each week we have an opportunity to increase in our faith. We have classes that develop and challenge our faith. Are we talking about what we learned in class or during worship? Are we sharing with our children what we learned? At the lunch table or on the car ride home, we talk about other lesser important things. We talk football. We talk movies or TV. We talk honey do lists. We are talking much less frequently about our faith with those outside of the church. Why? Do we fear talking about our faith or things we learn at Church with our friends or co-workers? Jesus issues the great commission to His Apostles in Matthew 28 and Mark 16. Paul writes in Romans 10:5-21, but specifically verse 14 "How are they to hear without someone preaching?". Are we talking about our faith? The Apostles could not stop talking about Jesus and their faith. Even when faced with death or isolation, they continued to talk about it.

I pray that we continue and thrive on talking about God, Jesus, our faith, and the church.
