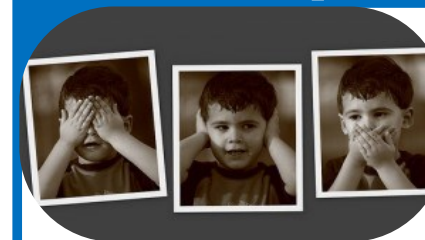

How is your hearing? Do you remember your last hearing tests? The ear is a fascinating organ. It funnels sound that your brain processes into words, music, or plain noise. It also aids in balance, with fluid in the inner parts of the ear.

There is an old saying that you have two ears and one mouth, so you ought to do twice as much hearing as speaking. In James 1, we read that we are to be quick to hear and slow to speak. We must be quick to hear the very words of God and slow to speak our thoughts and opinions. We need to be better listeners to each other instead of interrupting constantly trying to "one up" each other.

As we sing this song, we must be careful little ears what we hear. Last week, we spoke of the dangers of our tongues. The tongues we speak with can hurt and harm one another. Therefore, we must be careful what we hear so that our hearts are not defiled. Have you noticed a change in our media? The songs that are playing or the language choices that are used in TV and movies. It is easy to become dull to the language, the hatred, and the negativity towards others. We are filming more puppet skits for the Bible Hour class. We will meet at 6 PM, eat before you come.

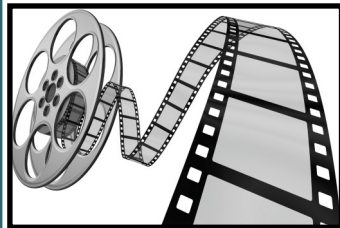
CYC WATCH PARTY- February 26-28

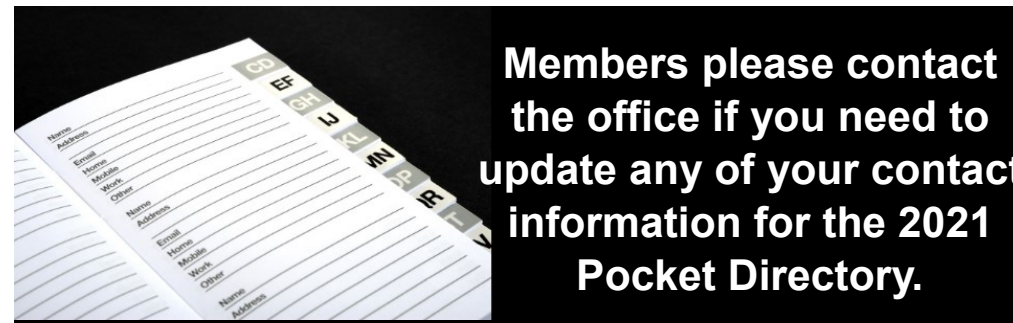
MOVIE NIGHT - February 20th 2 PM-5 PM

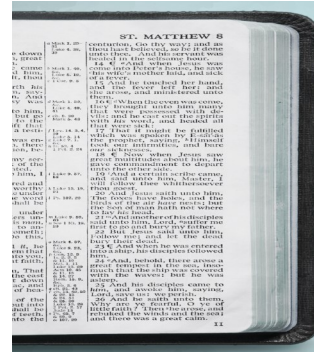
